Following his mother's journey to Qatar in search of better opportunities, he was brought up by his grandparents in Nakuru County.

He acknowledges their unwavering love and dedication, stating, "They are the kindest individuals I have ever encountered. They cared for me and nurtured me in the best possible way."

However, he mentioned that they encountered financial difficulties in covering his college fees. The situation became quite challenging to the extent that he had to take a temporary break from school. "I felt as though everything had come to an end, and my dreams were shattered. I was in a state of despair," Collins fondly recalled. Fortunately, it was not long before the MaryBeth Foundation provided the assistance he needed.

"I recall it was in September, and I had temporarily halted my studies due to financial constraints. Just one week before the enrollment deadline, my grandfather called me with life-changing news – I had been awarded a sponsorship by the MaryBeth Foundation."

A year and a semester later since he received the sponsorship, Collins conveyed his heartfelt appreciation to the MaryBeth Foundation, emphasizing that he could now pursue his studies without the burden of school fees. The start of Abigail Muita's challenging period of uncertainty regarding her ability to continue her education, began when her mother, then working at a small shop in Kiambu, accidentally transferred school fees to the wrong account. Abigail recalls that their efforts to recover the funds bore no fruits and she was forced to go back home.

Abigail, currently 20 years old, was raised by her mother and two sisters. Her mother, who worked as a housemaid at the time, had an income that covered only basic necessities like food and transportation, leaving insufficient funds for school fees. Fortunately, Abigail received a sponsorship from Friend Vision, which supported her education up to Form Four.

Abigail's aspiration to pursue college, akin to her peers, seemed like an unreachable dream due to her family's difficult situation. What compounded the dilemma was her mother taking a loan from her employer, only to see it accidentally deposited into the wrong account. "Following that ordeal, I had to remain at home as we worked to resolve the situation. This phase was exceptionally challenging, and I could feel depression encroaching due to a sense of hopelessness," Abigail shared.


Fortunately, the challenging situation was short-lived, and one day, she received news from her step-sister that she had been granted the MaryBeth Foundation scholarship to enroll at the Kenya Institute of Mass Communication, where she would pursue a Diploma in Animation and Graphics Design.

"I had left my documents and personal belongings at school in the Head of Security's office. Mr. Charles, the head of the security office, was the one who conveyed my situation to the MaryBeth Foundation, and, as the saying goes, the rest is history," Abigail recounted.

Abigail conveyed her deep appreciation to the foundation for granting her access to education. She said, "I am profoundly thankful for this opportunity. My course is incredibly fascinating, and I am constantly acquiring new knowledge. Working in the laboratory and engaging with animation software is a dream come true."
